More than 20 million pets in the United States currently live in poverty, according to the Humane Society of the United States. Your UUG Animal Ministry is helping, in a small but meaningful way, to insure that some of these animals are being provided food. While we are only meeting a small percentage of the demand, we are supplying 7 outlets in our local area with regular deliveries of pet food. We are currently providing animal food to SCCAP – Gettysburg

Upper Adams Food Pantry (Biglerville), Office of Aging Meals on Wheels(Gettysburg), the Fairfield Food Pantry, the Hanover Council of Churches, the New Oxford Pantry, and SCCAP Chambersburg. Many thanks to Lydia Obrist and Lauren DeFeo for coordinating these efforts. One of the ways we are supporting this effort is thru the recycle of aluminum cans - you will soon see a recycle bin for these cans by the back door of the church.

The annual Animal Ministry service at UUG will be Sunday May 19 – Rev. Cindy Terlazzo will be in the pulpit. We will soon be asking everyone to submit pictures of your loved animals for a video display. 
UUG's Auction Is Back For 2024!
